



Cascades of Change: Inclusive Leadership and Respectful Engagement

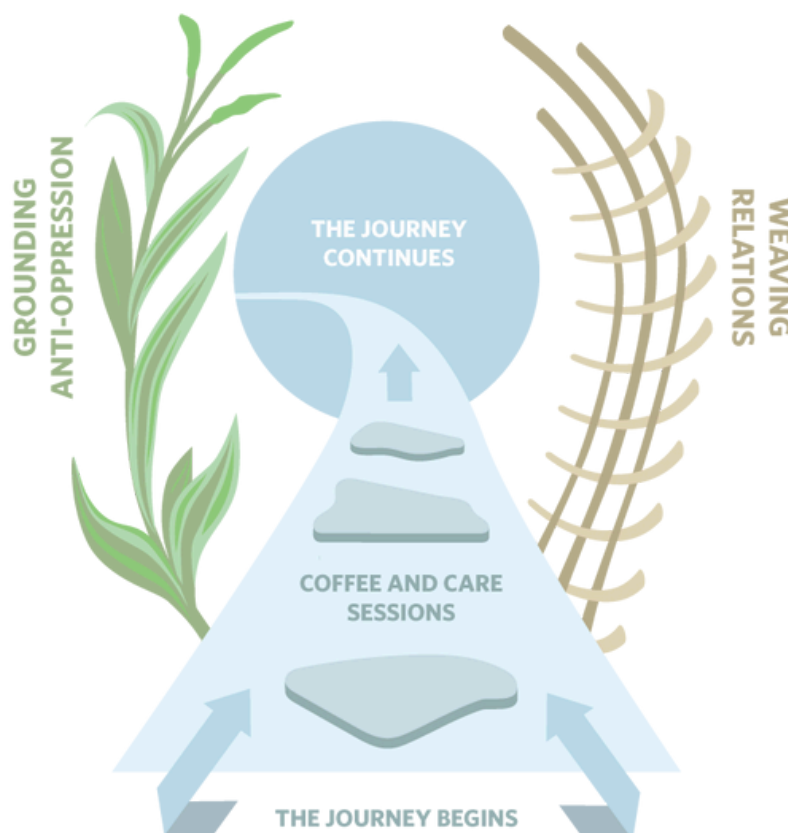
PROGRAM SUMMARY

The Applied Science Equity, Diversity, Inclusion & Indigeneity (EDI.I) Office, in collaboration with the Faculties of Land and Food Systems and Forestry, is offering a program, **Cascades of Change: Inclusive Leadership and Respectful Engagement**, for staff and faculty. To complete this program (25 hours after completing the prerequisite Canvas courses), you will participate in two side by side streams of study: **Anti-Oppression** and **Indigeneity**.

We hope this structure will encourage folks to demonstrate commitment to our Faculty's strategic priority area: [Inclusive Leadership & Respectful Engagement](#). Complete Cascades of Change to earn a certificate in both Anti-Oppression and Indigeneity.

COURSE OVERVIEW

- Participants should complete a minimum of two workshops and two experiential learning opportunities from both streams (including the reflective journaling component) to complete the program's course module component. Multiple opportunities will be scheduled; however, attendance is not compulsory for each one.
- Participants may substitute one experiential learning activity for their own choice activity - please obtain approval first.
- Assignments include a reflection journal required for each component and completion is indicated by 1 out of 1.
- Program completion includes a minimum of three Coffee and Care sessions.



Anti-Oppression

GROUNDING ANTI-OPPRESSION (6 HOURS)

Take **Grounding Anti-Oppression**, a self-directed course developed by the Faculties of Applied Science and Land and Food Systems. This introductory course explores EDI.I and anti-oppression work in university settings.

Participate in a minimum of two from each list of experiential learning activities.

WORKSHOPS

Attend a minimum of two **Weaving Relations** and two **Grounding Anti-Oppression** hybrid workshops. These workshops provide practical tools to apply knowledge of Indigeneity and anti-oppression in the workplace or classroom. In Community of Practice sessions, you'll share experiences and learn how others have integrated these principles into their professional and educational settings.

Indigeneity

WEAVING RELATIONS (6 HOURS)

Take **Weaving Relations**, a self-directed course developed by the Faculties of Applied Science and Land and Food Systems. This introductory course explores Indigenous histories, people and contexts, as well as settler colonialism in Canada.
